## A few words from the president

Hi Northeast Chapter!

Well it's officially fall and we're nearing the tail-end of the growing season. I hope everyone is getting out and enjoying some early fall color. I was working down in Franklin County last week and got to see one of my favorite tree species displaying its vibrant fall color. Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*) is a real beauty this time of year, with colors ranging all the way from golden yellow to crimson red and into purple, sometimes even on the same tree. Though the Chicago Region is outside its native range (it's native further south in Illinois), it's pretty widely planted there as a street tree or as specimen in a landscaped setting. For my Chicago Region native fall color dollar, I'd have to pick any of the serviceberry species (Amelanchier). The colors span the same range as sweetgum, and serviceberries also have edible fruits in early summer. Keep your eyes peeled for these beautiful plants over the next few weeks!

Alright, all this talk about our region's fall beauty reminds me that we have a great field trip coming up on Saturday, October 10. We'll be heading to Glacial Park in Richmond, IL and will be led on the hike by Laurie Ryan, the plant ecologist for the McHenry County Conservation District. To my knowledge it's been at least a couple years since we've had an INPS field trip in McHenry County, and we're very much looking forward to getting to tour one of the County's botanical hotspots. Check out the full description of the trip later in the newsletter. I hope you can join us!

We're also hoping to get at least another field trip in, either later in October or maybe early November. As always, we'll keep you posted on any new trip developments through email and Facebook. Hope to see you out in the field soon!
